THE APPLICATION PROCESS

The SFSP application process for returning sponsors includes the following steps:

- Returning sponsors are **required** to attend SFSP training as part of the application process in order to participate on the program. The information provided will assist in administering and operating the SFSP. - 2. Returning sponsors must complete a two-part application. The Summer Food Service Program Application Information for Returning Sponsors (Attachment 1), provides descriptions about program information you will need to complete the application process.

Complete the online application in Washington Integrated Nutrition System (WINS). WINS is an online system used to collect application information and to process claims for reimbursement. Part Two:

Complete application forms and documents. Use the sponsor checklist to guide you.

APPLICATION DUE DATE

Meals served prior to your application being approved cannot be claimed for reimbursement. To ensure sufficient application processing time, the application due date is based on the first day of program operations:

Program Appeal Rights and Procedure
