URGENT REPAIR GRANT

The 2018 Washington State Legislature appropriated \$3 million in capital funding for Health & Safety Urgent Repair Grants ([SSB6090 Section 5001](#)). Grants are solely for urgent repair grants to address non-reoccurring urgent small repair projects at K-12 public schools, excluding skill centers that could impact the health and safety of students and staff if not completed.

The districts are limited to one grant not to exceed \$200,000 per three year period and prioritization will be based on limited school district financial resources for the project.
