

5197 Survey Response Summary:



[RCW 28A.320.185](#) requires public schools to have current safe school plans and procedures in place, including planning for prevention, intervention, all hazard/crisis response, and post crisis recovery.

[SSSB 5197](#) requires school districts to work collaboratively with local law enforcement agencies and school security personnel to develop an emergency response system using evolving technology to expedite the response and arrival of law enforcement in the event of a threat or emergency at a school. It also required that each school district submit a progress report on its implementation of an emergency response system to the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction by December 1, 2014. Here are the results of the survey:

1. Of the **295** LEAS within the state:
 - a. **221** / 75% responded;
 - b. 74 / 25% did not respond.
 - c. 75 / **221** = 34% were 5197 grant recipients.

2. Within the 221 responding districts, as to the requirement for school safety plans:
 - a. SCHOOL safety plans = 211 / 95.5%
 - b. DISTRICT safety plans = 41 / 18.5%
