Please talk with your counselor about whether or not online learning is right for you and what support will help you be successful.

How to enroll:

If you want be a part-time online student:

- 1) Contact your local/resident school or district to find out what is available locally, and how you enroll.
- Work with a counselor or digital/online learning coordinator. They will enroll you with an approved provider.

If you want to be a full-time online student:

- 1) Contact your local/resident school or district to find out what is available locally, and how you enroll.
- 2) If your local/resident district does not offer the type of program you are looking for, review the list of public schools with online options.
- 3) Contact a program to find out if they have availability, when the enrollment period is open, and how you enroll.
- If you are accepted to a program, contact your local/resident district and request a Choice Transfer.
